

## Bijoux Bedrunner (30" x 70")



### Fabric requirements:

## Cutting instructions

### Block 1:

Fabric 1 – Cut 2x 4 7/8" by WOF (width of fabric) strips. From these cut 10x 4 7/8" squares, from these squares cut 20x half square triangles. Cut 1x 5 1/4" by WOF strip. From this cut 5x 5 1/4" squares, from these squares cut 20x quarter square triangles.

Fabric 2, 3, 4, 5 – Cut 1x 4 7/8" by WOF strip. From this cut 5x 4 7/8" squares, from these squares cut 10x half square triangles. Cut 1x 5 1/4" by WOF strip. From this cut 3x 5 1/4" squares, from these squares cut 10x quarter square triangles (you will have 2 left over).

### Block 2:

Fabric 6 – Cut 2x 4 7/8" by WOF (width of fabric) strips. From these cut 10x 4 7/8" squares, from these squares cut 20x half square triangles. Cut 1x 5 1/4" by WOF strip. From this cut 5x 5 1/4" squares, from these squares cut 20x quarter square triangles.

Fabric 7, 8, 9, 10 – Cut 1x 4 7/8" by WOF strip. From this cut 5x 4 7/8" squares, from these squares cut 10x half square triangles. Cut 1x 5 1/4" by WOF strip. From this cut 3x 5 1/4" squares, from these squares cut 10x quarter square triangles (you will have 2 left over).

### Sashing:

Fabric 3: Cut 9x 2 1/2" by WOF strips. From these cut 27x 12 1/2" by 2 1/2" strips.

Fabric 7: Cut 1x 2 1/2" by WOF strip. From this cut 18x 2 1/2" squares

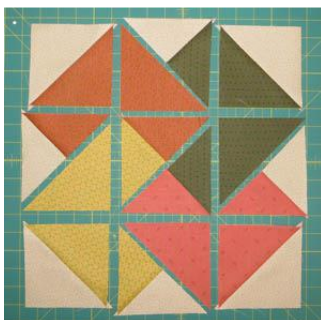
**Note – it is a good idea to leave cutting the sashing pieces until the blocks are made and trimmed, so you can match them up in case the blocks are not exactly 12 1/2" in size.**

### Binding:

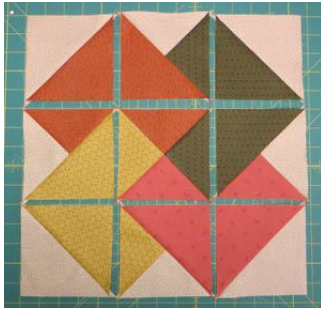
Fabric 8: Cut 6x 2.5" by WOF strips.

## Sewing instructions

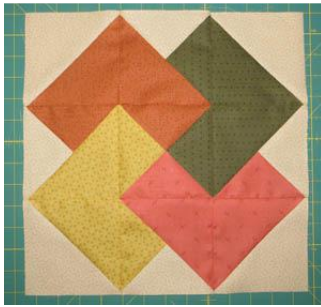
### Block 1:



1. Make 4 small blocks from half square triangles of fabrics 2, 3, 4 and 5 each sewn along the long side to half square triangles of fabric 1.
2. Sew quarter square triangles of fabrics 2, 3, 4 and 5 to quarter square triangles of fabric 1 to create 4 larger triangles.
3. Sew quarter square triangles of fabric 2 and 4 together, and fabric 3 and 5 together, to create 2 larger triangles for the centre block.
4. Lay out the pieces as shown and press.



5. Sew the centre block together as shown
6. Sew the centre top triangles together as shown
7. Sew the left and right middle triangles together as shown
8. Sew the centre bottom triangles together as shown.
9. You should now have 9 square blocks – press the seams and lay them out as shown



10. Sew together the three blocks in each horizontal row.
11. Press the seams in opposite directions on each row so that when sewing the rows together they butt up against each other – this makes accurate points more likely.
12. Sew the rows together and press.
13. Repeat instructions 1 -12 four more times to make 5 blocks.
14. Square up and trim each block to the same size.

Block 2:

Repeat instructions 1 – 14, but replace fabric 1 with fabric 6, 2 with 9, 4 with 7, 5 with 8 and 3 with 10.

**Quilt construction:**

15. Join the blocks and sashing strips in two rows of 5 blocks and 6 strips and press – the blocks are alternated so be sure to sew them as shown in the main picture.
16. Join 3 rows of sashing strips and squares, 5 horizontal strips and 6 squares in each row and press.
18. Sew together the sashing rows and block rows to finish the quilt top.



19. Sandwich the quilt top, wadding and backing together and baste or pin securely. Quilt as desired.

20. Trim the batting and backing to the size of the quilt top. Use the strips of fabric 8 for the binding, join together and bind the quilt. The quilt is now complete - if you have any questions or queries please don't hesitate to contact us at Pelella Patchworks!
