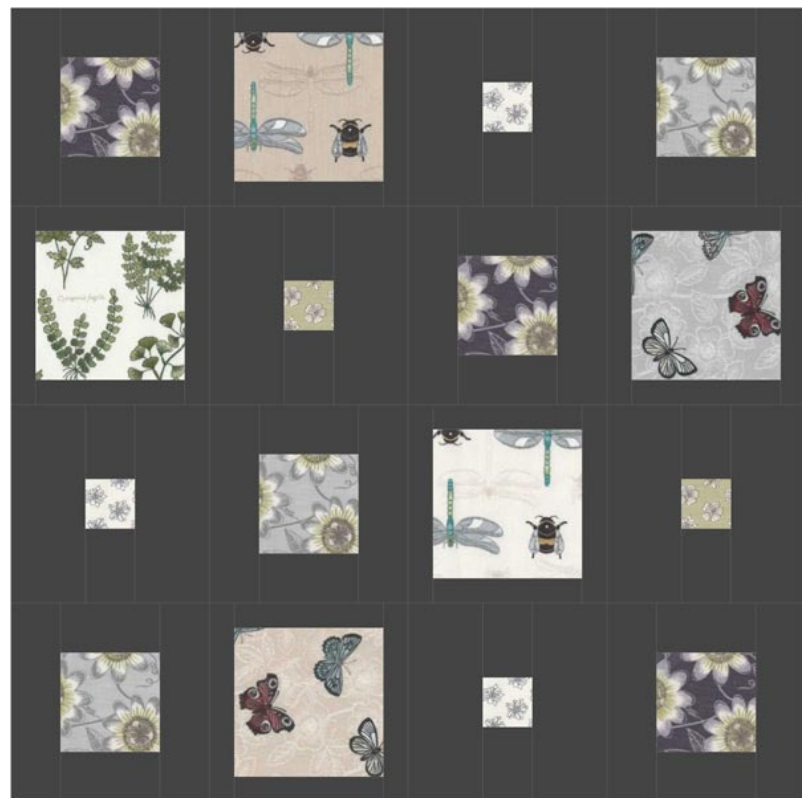
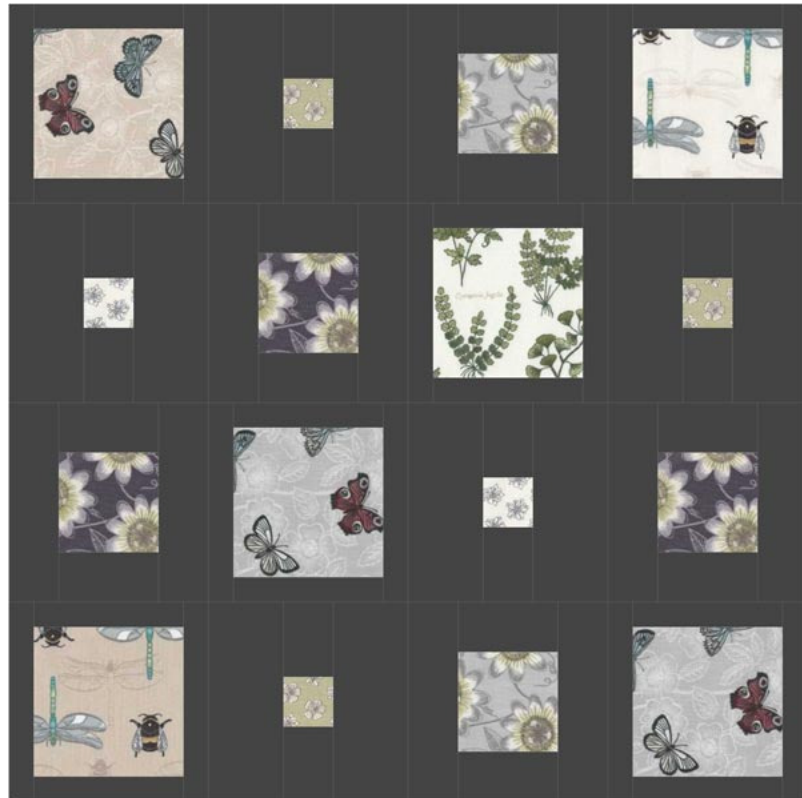


***The Botanist cushion cover set (16" x 16")***



**Fabric requirements:**

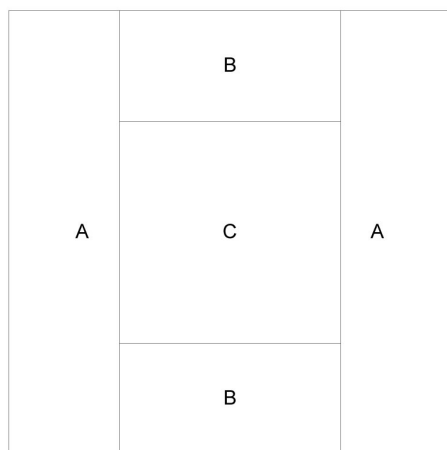
	1. Solids patchwork fabric - charcoal		6. The Botanist - cream ferns and leaves
	2. The Botanist - dark passion flower		7. The Botanist - sage small floral heads
	3. The Botanist - natural dragonfly and bee		8. The Botanist - grey butterfly sketch
	4. The Botanist - cream small floral heads		9. The Botanist - cream dragonfly and bee
	5. The Botanist - grey passion flower		10. The Botanist - natural butterfly sketch

1/8th metre of each print is required, plus 2m of the plain grey. Note - this pattern can be made using a 10 print stash pack.

Additional requirements - 1/2m backing fabric, 2x 17 inch squares quilt wadding, quilting & piecing thread.

**Block patterns:**

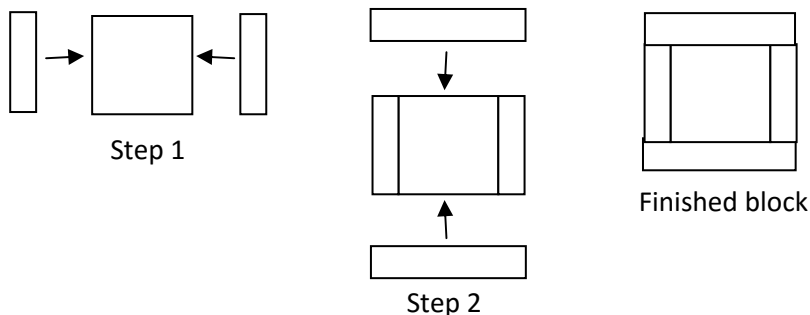
Block 1:



1. Cut 2 A patches - 4.5 inch x 1.5 inch
2. Cut 2 B patches - 2.5 inch x 1.5 inch
3. Cut 1 C patch - 2.5 inch x 2.5 inch
4. Sew B patches to C, press (figure 1 step 1).
5. Sew A patches to each long side (figure 1 step 2) to complete the block.

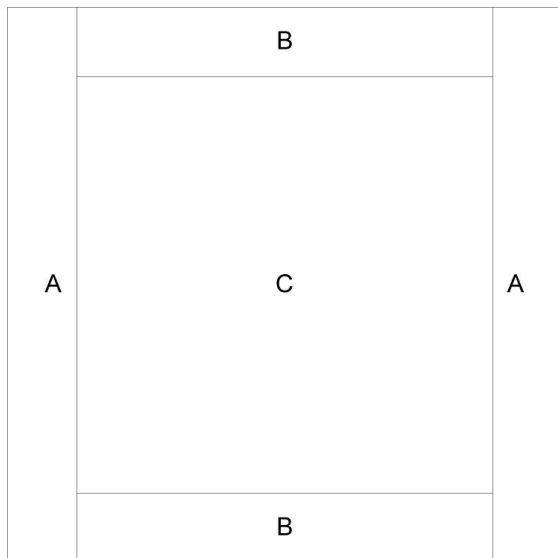
Make 6 x blocks using fabric 1 and fabric 2.

Make 5 x blocks using fabric 1 and fabric 5.

Block 2:



1. Cut 2 A patches - 4.5 inch x 1 inch
2. Cut 2 B patches - 3.5 inch x 1 inch
3. Cut 1 C patch - 3.5 inch x 3.5 inch
4. Sew B patches to C, press (figure 1 step 1).
5. Sew A patches to each long side (figure 1 step 2) to complete the block.

Make 2 x blocks using fabric 1 and fabric 10.

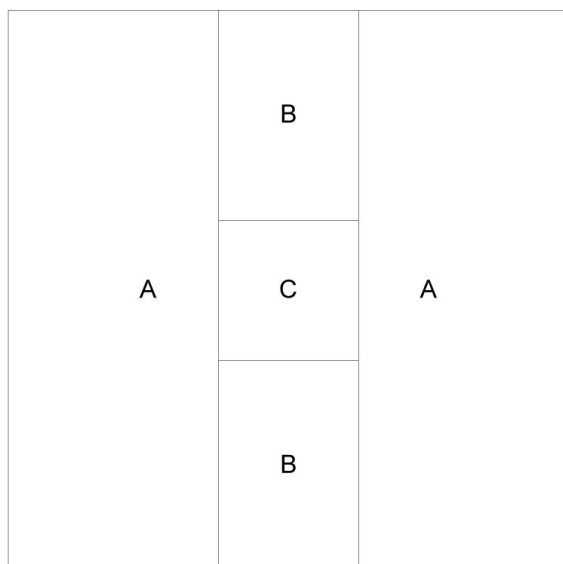
Make 2 x blocks using fabric 1 and fabric 9

Make 2 x blocks using fabric 1 and fabric 6.

Make 2 x blocks using fabric 1 and fabric 3.

Make 3 x blocks using fabric 1 and fabric 8.

Block 3:



1. Cut 2 A patches - 4.5 inch x 2 inch
2. Cut 2 B patches - 2 inch x 1.5 inch
3. Cut 1 C patch - 1.5 inch x 1.5 inch
4. Sew B patches to C, press (figure 1 step 1).
5. Sew A patches to each long side (figure 1 step 2) to complete the block.

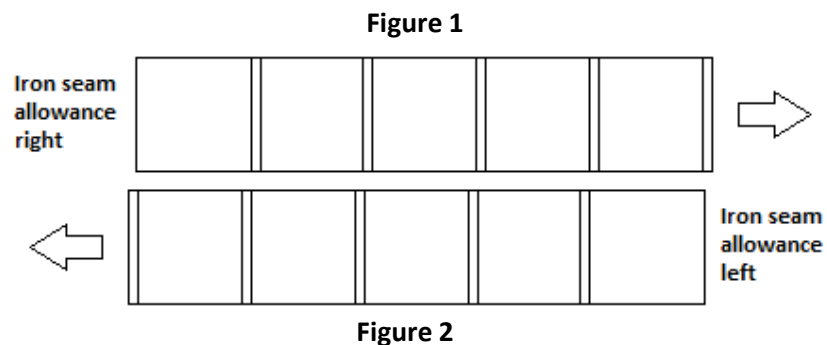
Make 5 x blocks using fabric 1 and fabric 7.

Make 5 x blocks using fabric 1 and fabric 4

**Construction:**

1. Arrange the finished blocks in the order shown in the main picture and sew together in rows. Sew the rows together to finish the cushion panels.

**Tip: When you press the seams flat on each of the strips, press them in opposite directions on adjacent strips so they butt up against each other - this should make it easier to ensure the squares are sewn accurately - see figure 2.**



2. Place the backing fabric, wadding and cushion top together to form a quilt sandwich, and baste or safety pin together. Quilt as desired. If you don't want to quilt the cushion leave out this step and just use a square of backing fabric to line the cushion to avoid fraying.
3. To make the back of the cushion cut two pieces 16.5" x 12" from fabric 1. On one long side of each iron under a 5/8" double folded hem. Sew along the hem in 2 parallel lines for maximum strength.
4. Place the backing pieces (overlap the hemmed edges) and the cushion top right sides together and pin. Sew around the outside with a 1/4 inch seam.
5. Turn the whole thing the right side out - your cushion cover is now complete! Repeat for the second cushion cover. If you have any questions or queries please don't hesitate to contact us at Pelenna Patchworks!



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
